

**20. AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE POSTING
OF BILLS, PLACARDS, AND NOTICES
(MAY 26, 1904)**

No person shall post in any manner, affix any bill, placard, or notice upon any fence, wall, tree, or private building in the City of Groton, without consent of the owner thereof; nor upon any building, sidewalk, or curbstone, fence, or post belonging to said city, nor upon any telegraph or telephone pole without the consent of the mayor, except that the mayor or license committee may, for such a fee as they deem proper, authorize any person pursuing the calling of a bill poster, to erect and maintain within the limits of said city, at such points and in such manner, and for such length of time, as said mayor or committee may prescribe, boards or posts upon which to post bills and notices, in the exercise of his calling. Any person offending against any of the provisions of this section, and any person who shall tear down, remove, or deface any bill, placard, or notice posted in conformity of this section, shall pay a fine of not more than ten dollars for each offense.
